They enjoyed being a scientist and completing their first 3rd grade science experiment. Students tested two oranges in a glass pitcher full of water. One orange had the peel, one did not. Students tested to see what would happen when the oranges were put into the pitcher full of water. The orange WITH the peel floated, the orange without the PEEL sank! The peel holds air which makes the orange buoyant to float. They completed all of the scientific method steps with this experiment!
