## A Letter in Regards to Sportsmanship

## Dear Patrons:

The program of interscholastic athletics at Friend Public School is an extension of the educational process. As such, just as in the classroom, the highest standards of instruction, communication and conduct are expected. Participation is a privilege that is earned by demonstrating exemplary conduct in all areas.
Sportsmanship has always been a foundational value of high school athletics. Along the way, because of the highly charged emotional environment, the intense interest, expanded media coverage, and the growing pressure to win, we may forget this ultimate objective of high school competition. Sportsmanship is not any one person or group's responsibility but is the responsibility of everyone involved: administrators, coaches, players, parents, students, and fans, as well as anyone else involved in the event. While sportsmanship is not the only value derived from participating in interscholastic athletics, it is the one that seems most threatened in today's competitive situations. Unfortunately, Friend Public School is not exempt from this growing decline of sportsmanship at athletic events. Last year, there were moments where I was not proud of our conduct as a whole. As a result of these lapses in collective judgment, the administration has decided to enlist the help of everyone involved in our athletic program to become more active in promoting good sportsmanship. If we are to maintain justification for our programs, we must unite to let all parties involved know that disrespectful behavior will not be tolerated at our athletic events.
To that end, we are stating that abusive and negative language and behavior will not be tolerated. Belittling the opponent or officials is counterproductive to the goals of interscholastic athletics and good sportsmanship. This behavior creates an uncomfortable environment for fans who want to support the team and enjoy the game. We are asking all parents and fans to keep comments positive and upbeat and directed to our team and coaches.
Unfortunately, we currently live in a world where fewer and fewer people choose to referee games or coach sports. I believe that these are the direct results of poor sportsmanship and behavior that is unbecoming of adults in the stands.
Please understand that the goal of this policy is not to single out any particular individual or group, but it is to allow everyone involved to know that good sportsmanship is the responsibility of everyone. We love seeing the stands full of fans who want to encourage our young athletes and students. Please simply consider this a friendly reminder that many eyes and ears are looking to you for the "example" and do your best to be the best.

Checklist for high school seniors who are college-bound (parents \& guardians -please encourage your son/daughter to stay on track):

Apply to at least 3 colleges before the end of the semester.
$\square$ Complete the FAFSA before the end of the semester (contact EducationQuest for assistance).

Check the "Scholarship Central" link on the school website AT LEAST once a week. There are numerous local scholarships that seniors could start turning in now!

Revisit "Scholarship Quest" on the Education Quest website AT LEAST once a week.
Update your high school resume NOW since you'll be using it during scholarship season.
$\square$ Identify three to five people who can be solid references as you apply for scholarships.
$\square$ Schedule time to see Ms. Hottovy is you need help with any of the above!

## 7-12 grade students and parents/guardians: please mark your calendars with these

 important dates:- December 14 is the deadline for $7-12$ grade students who wish to make a second semester schedule change. Teacher, parent, and administrative approval is required for all changes.
- Sophomores plus any interested Juniors \& Seniors will be taking the ASVAB test on the morning of December 7. This is a free opportunity for students to understand their unique skills and interests, identify potentially satisfying careers, and discover all the different ways to get to their dream job.
- Registration for spring SENCAP classes is due Wednesday, December 14. Interested 912 grade students (who are in solid academic standing) should be making appointments NOW to see Ms. Hottovy to discuss options. - March 21, 2023 -- juniors will take the ACT in the morning as part of state testing.


## Elementary parents/guardians:

- Ask your child about what he/she is learning during lessons with the school counselor! These are skills students should use both at school and at home.

- Middle elementary grades are practicing how to build new pathways in their brains, plus they are learning that mistakes are a natural part of growing.

- It's never too early to begin saving for your child's college expenses!
- Your child may be young now, but he/she will be graduating from high school before you know it.
- While you and your child's teachers are making sure the children are ready for higher education, be sure you have done your homework as well.

$\square$ Has your son/daughter completed a high school resume to use with scholarship applications?
$\square$ Has your son/daughter identified three to give people who can be solid scholarship references or writers of recommendation letters?
$\square$ Has your child scheduled time to see Ms. Hottovy for help with any of the above?

## Parents/guardians of juniors:

Preparation will soon begin to help our juniors be prepared to take the ACT on Tuesday, March 21, 2023. In 2016, the state of Nebraska mandated that state testing at the high school level be completed through a college entrance exam, and the ACT was selected. Our students will take the Reading, English, Math, Science, and Writing portions of the ACT.

Results from the ACT will be used for state reporting, plus numerous colleges and universities grant academic scholarships based on ACT scores. Watch for more information in next month's newsletter regarding practice sessions for students taking the ACT.

Juniors are also encouraged to schedule one college visit some time during the second semester. As long as required paperwork is turned in on time, this is an excused absence from school. Students should contact Ms. Hottovy for any questions or help needed with this process.
