From Superintendent Anderson

In an era defined by rapid technological advancements and instant access to information, the age-old habit of reading appears to be waning. For centuries, reading has been a cornerstone of intellectual development, cultural exchange, and personal growth. Yet, in today's digital age, traditional forms of reading — particularly books, newspapers, and long-form articles — are experiencing a notable decline. While there are many reasons for this, my goal is to challenge readers of this article to make reading a priority.

In my last 10 years of education, I have watched as students and adults alike are engaging less in reading. With a decline in critical reading (and reading in general) has come a decline in writing capabilities and overall critical thinking. As a school district, we continue to combat this issue. We are offering solutions in the name of a new curriculum and encouraging and urging teachers and students to read more. However, now I turn to the community and ask for your help and support.

In my 5 years of teaching psychology, there were many times that I learned right along with the students as new information continued to emerge. Information on brain development and cognitive function was constantly changing with new studies. Among all the pieces of information that continued to flow through my class was one that has stuck with me to this day as an educator. *Children observe what is important to their family and community based on what they see in mass.* Translation: if a child sees mostly screens as they develop in the early years, they learn to value and appreciate those screens above other objects. If children are exposed to an endless supply of books at home and through libraries on a regular basis, they will learn to value and appreciate books. This could be said for other things that could be valued at home such as food, clothes, animals, or cars. Looking around your home right now; what tangible items reflect you and your family's morals and priorities?

As a whole, all of these things can be appreciated and enjoyed. However, I write this being very concerned as an educator with the overall national decline in reading. Childhood reading continues to be strong, but as students transition to more challenging texts and informational texts, the love seems to be lost. This is not just a Friend/EMF problem; it is a national issue.

I have read articles that have cited college professors who are appalled by the lack of students being able to critically read informational texts as well as shutting down when presented with an article that is only a few pages long. This is a critical issue. If our future leaders are not readers, then how will we have new ideas and find solutions to problems in the world? When we look at our leadership in this country, readers are the ones leading. If we don't produce readers for the future, what kind of leaders will we have?

As we have begun the process of consolidation, it will be my goal to promote reading and literacy. While answers are in short supply on this issue, it is my goal within the walls of the school to promote reading and critical thinking and continue a push all the way through graduation. The solution is simple: read more. But HOW do we encourage and require that in our schools when reading is competing with so many other distractions?

I urge all of you with students in your life to not only talk about reading but model it as best you can. Start small. No one is asking you to read Tolstoy or Nietzsche. However, we all as a community need to model reading for a better future for this country, Nebraska and the small towns we are working to save.

As we begin 2025, many of us have New Year's resolutions. My resolution is both personal and professional. Reading, writing and critical thought will be my focus. It may end up being a resolution that lasts the rest of my life. My hope is that you will join me in this resolution and positively change the direction of our community and our students and, by doing so, the future.

Preparation will soon begin to help our juniors be prepared to take the ACT on Tuesday, March 25, 2025. In 2016, the state of Nebraska mandated that state testing at the high school level be completed through a college entrance exam, and the ACT was selected. Our students will take the Reading, English, Math, Science, and Writing portions of the ACT.

Results from the ACT will be used for state reporting, plus numerous colleges and universities grant academic scholarships based on ACT scores.
